Graduate Admission

Admission to Graduate Studies is granted to individuals with high promise for success in graduate study, as demonstrated through previous schooling and testing.

All applicants must hold a bachelor's degree or the equivalent from an accredited college or university. Applicants must have adequate undergraduate preparation in their proposed fields of study and show high promise for success in graduate study as demonstrated through previous schooling and testing. As an exception, auditors are not required to have a degree. Refer to the degree programs in this catalog for specific requirements.

The Graduate Admission operates on a rolling admission, that is, the application with required documents are evaluated as submitted on a rolling basis. Doctoral applicants should submit all admission documents by the priority deadline of February 1.

Application Requirements

- Online application
- Official transcript from all colleges and universities attended
- Official test scores: GRE, GMAT, or MAT as required by the program. The Educational Testing Service (ETS) institutional code for St. Mary's University is 6637.
- Two (2) letters of recommendation, preferably from a recent instructor and/or employer [three (3) letters are required for the doctoral program]
- Resume or Curriculum Vitae/C.V.
- Statement of Purpose/Professional goal statement
- Specific essay required for Public Administration and Theology programs

International Student Graduate Admissions

Admission to Graduate Studies is granted to individuals with high promise for success in graduate study, as demonstrated through previous schooling and testing. All applicants must hold a bachelor's degree or the equivalent from an accredited college or university. Applicants must have adequate undergraduate preparation in their proposed fields of study and show high promise for success in graduate study as demonstrated through previous schooling and testing.

Please refer to degree programs for specific requirements. In accordance with SEVIS I17 regulations, conditional admittance can no longer be offered to international students.

The Aptitude Test of the Graduate Record Examination (GRE), the Graduate Management Admissions Test (GMAT), and the Miller Analogies Test (MAT) requirements will vary according to program. Students from foreign countries must submit test scores prior to admission. Test scores may be waived for students who have completed a graduate degree from a U.S. accredited institution or who are seeking admission into the Public Administration or Theology programs. Waiver requests or exemptions are reviewed on a case-by-case basis and subject to the discretion of the Program Directors and Academic Dean.

All international student applicants whose first language is not English must demonstrate proficiency in English by submitting the results of TOEFL or IELTS exam. Test scores may not pre-date the student's application by more than six (6) months. Official scores must be sent directly to St. Mary's University from the testing agency (school code 6637). Whereas applicants from a non-U.S. university in a country where the primary language of instruction is English will have the English language proficiency exam waived. (Refer to St. Mary's website for list of TOEFL exempt countries).

The minimum score for admission to a graduate program is 6.0 on the IELTS exam, except for the MBA for Values-driven Leaders and MBA for Professionals require a minimum 6.5 IELTS. Minimum scores for admission to a graduate program on the TOEFL exam is a minimum 80 and the MBA for Values-driven Leaders and MBA for Professionals require a minimum 87 TOEFL. Students who score 6.0 on the IELTS exam or 80-82 on the internet based TOEFL exam will be required to complete English coursework.

English courses must be completed within the first semester(s) of attendance. Students who score a 6.0 on the IELTS or 80-82 on the TOEFL must complete EN 6301 during the first FA/SP semester. If necessary, the graduate program director may require a student with minimum scores to complete EN 6300 during their first FA/SP semester and EN 6301 in the subsequent FA/SP semester. Students who fail to comply may have their admission rescinded. A Designated School Official (DSO) may also cancel/terminate the student's I20 or DS2019 status.

Graduates of U.S. colleges or universities are not required to submit TOEFL or IELTS scores, or demonstrate written competency in English. English language proficiency exams are not required for students who have earned a bachelor's degree or equivalent from a non-U.S. university in a country where the primary language of instruction is English. Requests for waivers or exemptions are reviewed on a case-by-case basis, and are subject to the discretion of the Academic Dean.
