Transfer Students

A transfer student is any student new to St. Mary's University who enrolled at another college/university or earned college credit after high school graduation prior to attendance at St. Mary's University.

Admission Requirements:

1. Application for Admission - A completed application for admission is available using either the St. Mary's University online application at www.stmarytx.edu or ApplyTexas application.
2. Transcripts - Present an official transcript from each college-level institution attended. Failure to list all previously attended institutions on the application can result in future dismissal.

Transfer students with fewer than 30 transferable semester hours of college work must submit an official high school transcript from which the student graduated or an official copy of the General Education Development Diploma (GED) test results with standardized test results (ACT or SAT).

Upon admission to the St. Mary's University, all course work from regionally accredited institutions and foreign institutions will be evaluated for equivalent credit on a course-by-course basis provided a grade of "C" (2.0/4.0) or higher is recorded on an official transcript. The grades of transfer courses are not computed in the St. Mary's grade point average.
